Medications for opioid use disorder (MOUD):

- normalize brain chemistry
- relieve cravings
- prevent withdrawal symptoms
- lower the risk of an overdose by 50%

Along with support from friends, family, and treatment professionals, MOUD help people safely recover.

Methadone & buprenorphine

- Are safe and effective MOUD
- Help people rebuild lives and relationships
- Can be dispensed to people of all ages



Naloxone

Relapse may be a part of recovery. An overdose is more common after a period of not using opioids. Carry naloxone and use it to reverse an overdose. It saves lives and makes continued recovery possible.
